OPENING STATEMENT FROM CEO

Dear Champion,

Fleeing an abusive home, Dwayne spent his teenage years in and out of Detroit shelters. He found respite in a library–spending time inside during operating hours to get out of the elements and sleep outside at night. He struggled to find places to wash up and secure food. He worked hard to hide his homelessness. He desperately wanted to avoid the stigma.

Then a chance meeting at a coffee shop connected Dwayne with a representative of the Detroit Phoenix Center (DPC). DPC helped him with hotel stays when he needed to keep out of the cold. Eventually, he secured more permanent housing, including his first month's rent with the support of our nonprofit and moved on to become a leader on our youth action board. The story does not stop there. He returned to DPC and continues donating his time to help others as a drop-in services volunteer.

Dwayne's story is not unique, but it is because of your generosity throughout the year that the DPC can positively impact countless individuals with similar stories to Dwayne's in the Detroit community. And let me tell you, your support in 2023 allowed us to have a banner year in our achievements on behalf of Detroit's youths.

In 2023, DPC was able to achieve several milestones, including:

- Providing critical services and resources to over 1,700 individuals, including emergency housing, food, cell phone gifts cards, transportation and mental health support.
- Providing 1,577 hours of academic, workforce development and mental health programming.

- Partnering with *Homeless Action Network of Detroit* and the Detroit CoC to provide young leaders a seat at the table in efforts to prevent, end and address youth homelessness.
- Fully operationalizing *our new home at Youthville*, located in the heart of the city in Detroit's New Center. With this move, DPC has served twice as many youths with our wrap-around programs and services.
- Launching new programs; such as launching season 2 of our youth led podcast, *Detroit Youth Rising*. This new podcast series was created by DPC youth and is for youth in the community. The podcast is designed to provide young people with a platform to raise awareness of social issues they are passionate about.
- Partnering with local *organizations and businesses to expand* our reach and better serve our community's needs.

None of these accomplishments would have been possible without your support. Your contributions are making a real difference in the lives of those who need it most.







In 2023, DPC became fully operational at Youthville Detroit on Woodward Avenue to expand its reach and serve more youth.

In FY23, DPC has set an ambitious goal of serving more than 1,700 unduplicated individuals, with incremental increases each year thereafter.

The new space would serve as the mainstay of the organization — housing the drop—in center, housing intervention, office spaces, after school and workforce development programming, and a social enterprise.

where Youthville is located, has been named as the district with the largest number of students who have been identified as experiencing homelessness, uniquely positioning DPC to more effectively address this issue. The grand opening ceremony took place in November 2022.

Expanded its Youth Leadership Program

Through its Trailblazer Youth Action Board (YAB) and Young Change Makers Fellowship, DPC engaged 35 young people, ages 13-24 in intentional, productive, and constructive ways while recognizing and enhancing their strengths to promote positive outcomes.



DPC received funding from the McGregor Fund to expand its youth leadership program and provide wrap-around supportive services to youth enrolled.

YouthUP Resource App


In 2023, we finialized our resource app, Youth Up, with and for youth in Detroit. This app was delveloped by **Detroit Labs**, a custom software development company -- who selected DPC to receive pro-bono support, valued at \$50,000.






Youth Up connects youth with a much-needed database of resources (ranging from food pantries to emergency shelters to legal assistance) that they can access using their phone and a public computer.

In addition to a robust rolodex of youth centric resources throughout the region, Youth Up allows young people to schedule appointments and services at DPC.







Youth Up: Quick Assistance enables youth to connect more easily and rapidly to services and form social connections virtually, which proved to be paramount as a result of the coronavirus pandemic.



Instead of a simulation, this challenge served as a call to action to help ensure young people no longer live with housing insecurity and threats to their well being.


